Here we are then, part way through our second national lockdown but still going strong! PAM'S TRIFLE - A Christmas contribution from Ali

It's called Pam's trifle as it was first made by a Slimming World friend and has now become famous! It's made in a slimming world way so is delicious whilst having no fat and sugar so you can eat as much as you wish.

Ingredients:

- 1 sachet Hartley's sugar free jelly crystals made up to 1 pint
- Fresh or frozen berries of your choice

For the custard layer:

- 2 fat free Muller light banana & custard yoghurts
- 1 fat free Muller light vanilla yoghurt
- 6 sheets gelatine

For the topping:

- 1 x 500g tub fat free Greek yoghurt
- 1 fat free Muller light vanilla yoghurt
- 1 tbsp granulated sweetener



Make up jelly and pour into a dish (or individual dishes). Add fruit as desired and chill to set.

Once set, mix the banana & custard yoghurts with the vanilla one, add the gelatine (see packet for instructions) and spread over jelly layer, then chill until set.

Once this is set, mix Greek yoghurt with the remaining vanilla yoghurt, add sweetener to taste and spread over the custard layer.

Yoghurts can be changed to different flavours if desired but I find these flavours work best.


