There will be quiz sheets for sale on the night £1 each - perfect to keep everyone mentally stimulated over the Christmas period - also ideal to put inside Christmas cards and send to friends so that they can be mentally stimulated too!! Answers will be provided in the post-Christmas Newsletter.
